Synopsis and History

Synopsis

In 1930's New York, wealthy Bobby Child dreams of being a dancer on the Broadway stage, but his ambitions are thwarted by his overbearing Mother and demanding fiancee, Irene.

When Bobby is sent to Deadrock, Nevada to repossess an old theatre for the family bank, he falls in love with Polly Baker - the only woman in town. However his plans for romance are thwarted when she discovers he is there to foreclose on the theatre - which belongs to her father, Everett. When Polly announces she wants nothing more to do with Bobby, he decides to take drastic action and disguises himself as famous impressario Bela Zangler and put on a show to save the theatre.

Before Bobby can save the day and win the girl of his dreams he has to deal with love rivals, lost tourists, dancing girls, a lovestruck impressario, a tenacious fiancee, cowboys with two left feet, and, even worse, his Mother!

History

Crazy for You, by George and Ira Gershwin, is largely based on the songwriting team's 1930 musical Girl Crazy, but incorporates songs from several other productions too. Ethel Merman made her musical theatre debut in Girl Crazy and the show also made an overnight star of Ginger Rogers. Crazy For You continues to delight audiences and critics alike, including the 1992 Broadway production which ran for 1,622 performances and won several Tony awards, including Best Musical. In his review in The New York Times, Frank Rich wrote ... 'Crazy for You scrapes away decades of cabaret and jazz and variety-show interpretations to reclaim the Gershwins' standards, in all their glorious youth, for the dynamism of the stage.' The 1993 London production, starring Ruthie Henshall, proved equally popular and ran for nearly three years, winning three Olivier awards, including Best New Musical.






