


ANNIE TUCKER - Sarah Brown

During that time she has played principal roles in over forty shows for many companies throughout North London and Hertfordshire. Her favourites include Eurydice (Orpheus in the Underworld) Adele (Die Fledermaus) and Eliza (My Fair Lady) but she also enjoys Mozart and most Gilbert and Sullivan. JULIA HARRIS - Miss Adelaide


