

# High Society

Music and Lyrics by Cole Porter **Book by Arthur Kopit** Additional Lyrics by Susan Birkenhead

Cole Porter's sparkling film musical (1956) 'High Society' is based on Philip Barry's successful Broadway stage play 'The Philadelphia Story' especially written in 1940 for Katherine Hepburn. The original film of 'The Philadelphia Story' was adapted by Donald Ogden Stewart, directed by George Cukor and starred Katherine Hepburn, Carry Grant and James Stewart. The romantic comedy film musical 'High Society' was produced by Sol C Siegel and directed by Charles Walters for MGM Studios. It starred Grace Kelly, Bing Crosby, Frank Sinatra and Louis Armstrong. The famous score includes the classic songs: 'Who wants to be a millionaire', 'Well did you ever', 'True Love' and 'Samantha'.

'High Society' takes place on the eve of a Long Island society wedding. A rich heiress is about to marry for the second time when her first husband (who is still in love with her!) turns up again - as does a very attractive society columnist! The spoilt girl is in a quandary, even as the guests arrive we are left guessing who will be her groom...

#### Cole Porter

Along with Irving Berlin, Frank Loesser, Jerry Herman and Stephen Sondheim, Cole Porter is one of the few top-flight lyricists who composed his own music. Born into a rich farming family in Peru, Indiana, on June 9 1891, Cole Albert Porter began his prodigious song-writing career while still at Yale University. He swiftly captivated New York society and established himself as a force on Broadway. His biggest hit show was 'Kiss me Kate' (1948) followed by 'Silk Stockings' and 'Can Can' in the 50s. Porter's sophisticated style made him a huge success in Hollywood and his score for 'High Society' (Arthur Kopit's screenplay of Philip Barry's stage play 'The Philadelphia story') is sheer perfection.

Cole Porter wrote five of the thirty highest earning popular songs of all time. His well-known hits include: 'Let's do it, let's fall in love' 'Night and Day', 'I get a kick out of you', 'In the still of the night' and 'Love for sale'. He was married to Linda Lee Thomas one of the richest and most beautiful women in the world. His charmed life was blighted in his forties by a tragic riding accident. Cole underwent over 35 operations on his badly mutilated legs. In constant pain he carried on writing joyous songs until his death in 1964, aged 73.




#### Sue Payne - Director





#### Howard Wright George Kittredge



# Putting on a show...

So here we are again, back at the Wyllyotts for "Another Op'nin, another show"!

We perform two musicals a year and a lot of work is involved in getting them to you.

As you settle into your seats eagerly anticipating this performance of "High Society", perhaps you might like to learn a little of what is involved.

When we have booked our slots in the theatre and been granted a licence to perform our chosen show, we then book our production team, which consists of a director, musical director and sometimes a choreographer. They will call a production meeting with the committee where subjects such as the budget, rehearsal dates, sets, costumes, lighting, sound and props are discussed. Approximately 4-5 months before show week the cast meet to begin musical rehearsals. Soon after this, auditions are held and parts are cast. Rehearsals really step up a gear now with people desperately trying to learn lines, music and dance routines. Sometimes we have to do all three at the same time! We rehearse on two evenings a week in Winchmore Hill, but nearer to show week we will also do some Sundays.

With a few weeks to go, the publicity drive begins. Posters, flyers and the programme have to be designed, printed and displayed; letters and flyers sent out to everyone on our mailing list (currently more than 600); cast photos have to be taken and press coverage has to be arranged.

The week leading up to the show is a mad dash of last minute rehearsals, press interviews, costume and wig fittings, rounding up our front-of-house volunteers, oh ... and selling even more tickets! On the Sunday before show week, we all arrive at the theatre early for delivery and set up of the scenery, a band call (where we singthrough with the orchestra for the first time, instead of just a lone piano at rehearsals), and a technical rehearsal in the evening, where scenery changes, sound and lighting are given a priority.

Monday night is dress rehearsal in full costume and make-up where any last minute hitches are ironed out. After weeks of rehearsing in normal clothes in an ordinary church hall, it is always exciting to see the sets, wear the costumes and to run through the show on the stage for the first time. Then Tuesday night is First Night! It is a great atmosphere back stage, with lots of laughs, mad costume changes and searching for missing props. We're all shattered by now but keep going on adrenalin and a vast chocolate consumption! After the two shows on Saturday, we clear the theatre of all sets and costumes and head off to the after show party which is naturally very quiet and restrained!

I hope this gives you some idea of what it takes to put on a show. If you enjoyed "High Society" please come again to all our future shows. Or why not consider joining us on or off stage?! We are a very welcoming group; indeed one of us said recently "you know, we're just a group of good friends who happen to like performing in our spare time". Come along to a rehearsal and give it a try, because as the song goes, "There's no business like show business"!!




