#### CHARACTER BIOGRAPHIES

#### MUSICAL DIRECTOR / Mark Newport

Mark is currently working on Les Miserables, (for which he has conducted performances both in London and on the U.K. tour) and Phantom of the Opera. Other West End credits include Sunset Boulevard, Starlight Express, Martin Guerre and The Goodbye Girl. As Musical Director he has performed at Sadler's Wells, the Mermaid, (Royal Gala) Whitehall and Bloomsbury Theatres. He was also Assistant Conductor for Opera East on six national tours.

Mark is a member of Musical Theatre staff at the Guildford School of Acting and Mountview. This is Mark's 29th show with E.L.O.D.S.

#### DIRECTOR / Clive Bebee

Clive happily alternates his own performing career with his second love, directing. He has so far directed Operas Aida & Werther.
