




History and Synopsis

History

How to Succeed in Business without Really Trying is based on Shepherd Mead's 1952 book of the same name, subtitled The Dastard's Guide to Fame and Fortune. The show, starring Robert Morse, opened on Broadway in October 1967 and won seven Tony awards, The New York Drama Critics Circle Award, and the 1962 Pulitzer Prize for Drama. In 1967, a film was released with many of the original cast recreating their roles. A 50th anniversary Broadway revival starring Daniel Radcliffe opened in March 2011 and ran for 473 performances. ELODS have performed the show twice before and are thrilled to bring it to you again. The New York Herald Tribune said it was 'crafty, conniving, sneaky, cynical, irreverent, impertinent, sly, malicious and lovely, just lovely' and we hope you will agree!

Synopsis

Enjoy watching the rise to power of J. Pierrepont Finch, a cheeky and ambitious young window cleaner, who climbs the ladder of success in The World Wide Wicket Company, with only his wit, charm and an instruction manual to help him. But when he finds himself having to deal with a knitting-mad boss, a jealous rival, and the boss's ditsy mistress, Finch discovers success in business is not as simple as he first thought. Meanwhile, he falls for Rosemary, a secretary who dreams of escaping the drudgery of big business for married bliss in suburbia. Can a combination of luck, ingenuity and downright cheek save Finch's career and get him the girl?!




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WANTED

We hope to hear from you soon.



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


