

Message from the Chairman







Synopsis and History

Synopsis

In 1930s Cleveland, Ohio, impresario Henry Saunders is pinning his hopes on a celebrity gala to restore the fortunes of his ailing opera company. The world's most famous tenor, Tito Merelli, is scheduled to perform Verdi's Otello, and the whole of Cleveland is dying to meet him, including Saunders' star-struck daughter Maggie and scheming soprano Diana Divane, who believes Merelli can make her a star. When Merelli and his wife Maria eventually arrive, Saunders gives the job of looking after the volatile pair to his long-suffering assistant Max, but by the time Merelli is due to take to the stage, disaster has struck.

Chaos ensues, as Saunders and Max have to save the gala while coping with multiple Otellos, demanding ex-wives, the Cleveland police force, a missing corpse, and a potentially explosive plate of shrimp salad!

History

Lend Me a Tenor - The Musical is based on the 1986 play Lend Me a Tenor by Ken Ludwig. The original play won two Tony Awards and ran for 476 performances on Broadway. The Musical version was originally produced by the Utah Shakespearean Festival in 2006, and had its UK premiere in September 2010 at The Theatre Royal Plymouth, before transferring to the Gielgud Theatre in London in 2011. The West End production featured a star cast, including Matthew Kelly and Joanna Riding. In spite of a brief run, the show received rave reviews and was nominated for a Laurence Olivier award.

Set in the 1930s, the story revolves around various cases of mistaken identity, mostly the result of the "Blackface" make-up being used for the character of Otello in the Cleveland Opera Company's production of Verdi's opera. Although seeing a performer "black up" to portray a black character is not generally acceptable to modern audiences, it is worth noting that eighty years ago, it would have been the theatrical norm.

Production Team


Choreographer - David Adams
