Short Synopsis:- The first collaboration between Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II, broke all box office records when it opened in 1943. As the first musical to tell a story with music, dance and lyrics, Oklahoma! forever changed the form of musical theatre.

The show is set in the Indian territory at the turn of the century when cattlemen and farmers were fighting over fences and water rights. In the middle of that controversy are two more rivalries. One between a cowboy called Curly and hired hand named Jud, both in love with Laurey. The second involves Ado Annie, Will and Ali Hakim, a trio that will provide plenty of laughs. The music and lyrics have proven to be the best in American theatre with songs that include "Oh What a Beautiful Morning", The Surrey with the Fringe on Top", "People will Say We're in Love". "I Cain't Say No", "Oklahoma!" and many more, making this a musical treat for all the family.

DIRECTOR / Sue Stannard
