

Gama and his 3 sons arrive but without Ida, since she is now head of a womens university in England and will have nothing to do with men. Gama and his sons are thrown into jail and Hilarion goes to England to storm the university.

ACT II Gardens of Castle Adamant, England

Hilarion and his two friends sneak into the University at Castle Adamant dressed as students.

They are discovered by Ida during a picnic who demands that they are ousted. In the confusion Ida falls into the moat and is rescued by Hilarion. Hildebrand arrives with his army to claim Ida as his son's bride but she, with her students, defy them.

ACT III Gardens of Castle Adamant, England

The students, one by one, desert Ida, leaving her completely alone. However Gama and Ida's three brothers arrive just in time to do battle with Hilarion and his two friends. Ida's brothers lose the fight and Ida is persuaded to resign her post and yield to Hilarion.

ANTHONY GOLDING - King Hildebrand

Anthony Golding has been involved in local amateur operatics since 1974, latterly with Southgate College Opera and ELODS. Particular favourites are close harmony singing roles in "Music Man" and "The Most Happy Fella", and all the Savoy Operas. Previous G&S roles include Pooh-Bah, Sgt. Meryll, Grosvenor, Don Alhambra, having started at school, as Ruth in "Pirates".

STEPHEN ROE - Hilarion

Stephen studied music at Goldsmiths College and singing at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Previous G&S roles include Poo Bah in "The Mikado", the Pirate King in "Pirates of Penzance" and Ludvic in the "Grand Duke". Locally, Stephen has played Frederick in "My Fair Lady" and Valentine in "White Horse Inn". This is Stephens' first production with ELODS.





JAMES INWOOD - King Gama

Jim is a veteran of more than 50 shows in the last 20 years. He first joined ELODS in 1977 and principal parts with them include Pooh-Bah in "The Mikado", John Wellington Wells in "The Sorcerer", Samuel in "The Pirates of Penzance" and more recently Brown Bear in "Little Mary Sunshine". He has previously played King Gama twice with other companies.



ANNIE TUCKER - Princess Ida

Annie was born in Wolverhampton but has lived in the
"deep south" for 20 years. She is a member of
Choreodrama and Ware Operatic Society (when she
remembers to pay her membership fee) and various other
local societies have risked having her play principle roles
with them. Her favourite roles include: Eliza Doolittle,
Eurydice ("Orpheus"), Adele ("Fledermaus") and the
contents of a sack in "Underneath the Arches".

DORA BASHAM - Director

Dora Basham has directed over 50 shows mainly in North London – but this year she has extended her area by taking her own company; Skylark Theatre Group, to the Edinburgh Festival Fringe. Next years productions include Offenbach's "Chatterbox" at Colchester, "Eugene Onigin" with Southgate College Opera and hopefully a Sondheim production with Skylark at Millfield Theatre in July, culminating with another trip to Edinburgh.





MARK NEWPORT - Musical Director

Since leaving the Royal Academy of Music in 1985 Mark has enjoyed a successful career as a freelance musician. He has been Musical Director for 'panto' with Bernie Winters, played keyboards in "Starlight Express" and is on the music staff for Opera East (who are presently touring with "La Boheme" and "Cosi fan Tutti"). Mark is also Musical Director for "Young Stars of Tomorrow" which in 1990 included a Royal Gala and in 1991 performances at Sadlers Wells. This is Mark's twelfth show as Musical Director with ELODS.
