For South Pacific, we are delighted to welcome back Sue Payne as director and who has choreographed the show as well.






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TALES OF THE SOUTH PACIFIC

SYNOPSIS

South Pacific centres around Nellie Forbush, an American nurse stationed on a Pacific Island during World War II. She falls in love with the middle-aged Emile de Becque, a local planter with a dubious past. However, when she learns he is a widower with two mixed race children, she cannot accept the situation. Meanwhile, Lieutenant Cable falls in love with a beautiful Polynesian girl named Liat, the daughter of Bloody Mary, but realises the social consequences of marrying his sweetheart. Cable and de Becque are sent on a dangerous mission into enemy territory, leaving Nellie and Liat to await their return.

HISTORY

The musical South Pacific was based on the prize-winning novel by James Michener, Tales of the South Pacific. Michener was born in New York City, and served in the United States Navy during World War II. In 1948, while an editor in a New York publishing house, he won the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction for Tales of the South Pacific.

With music by Richard Rodgers and lyrics by Oscar Hammerstein II, the first performance took place on Broadway on March 7th, 1949, and was an immediate hit, running for 1925 performances. All the characters featured in the musical version appear in the original book. Like the original book, the musical also received a Pulitzer Prize – this time for Drama in 1950. The Broadway production won ten Tony awards, and the cast album was the bestselling record of the 1940s. However, the racial themes in the piece proved controversial with some audiences, especially in the Southern Us states.

When the musical reached London in 1951, one of the sailors in the chorus was a young Sean Connery, who later admitted he could neither sing nor dance, however, he certainly looked the part.

So from the exotic world of the South Pacific, with its seemingly endless ocean, the tiny specks of coral, the coconut palms, the waves breaking into spray against the reefs, the full moon rising beyond the volcanoes, comes the setting for the musical you are about to enjoy, with its story of love, life and war.

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
Musical Director - Mark Newport


PRODUCTION TEAM




Bloody Mary - Sandra Ashworth



MILITARY LIFE IN SOUTH PACIFIC...

When South Pacific premiered in 1949, the world was obviously still living under the lasting shadow cast by World War II. As such, the writers were able to assume that their audience had a good knowledge of military terms and rank, however for a 21st-century audience, the military details of the show can be somewhat alien, and some of the more subtle details of the script can go unnoticed by modern eyes.

Captain Brackett and Commander Harbison are the most senior ranking characters in the show. The junior ranks would always have saluted them, but on their first entry this doesn't happen, and the Captain doesn't remark on this slight. Whether this is a result of the Captain's preoccupation with Bloody Mary, or because he pretends not to notice is not clear, but it does demonstrate early on that there may be a disturbance in the usual order in this far-off place.

Similarly, as a Marine Lieutenant, Joseph Cable would have expected a salute from the lower ranks when he arrived on the island, but Luther Billis encourages the men not to rise and salute Cable – perhaps suggesting that he considers himself "in charge" in that situation. Billis is an interesting character, as he displays little or no respect for authority, unless it is for his own gain. Ultimately though, he does not come out on top.

The enlisted men are Sailors, Marines and Seabees. Sailors serve at sea, Marines are amphibious troops who serve on ships and land, and Seabees are sailors in the Construction Batallion (hence "CB"). The Seabees are responsible for the construction and maintenance of the military bases and equipment.

The serving personnel in *South Pacific* are not directly involved in the war at this time, and so military life seems decidedly casual, and at times even lighthearted, but the war is ever present in the characters' lives, and the threat of direct military action is never far away.
