DISABLED PERSONS

The theatre has been designed to cater fully for the needs of disabled visitors. There is easy horizontal access for wheelchairs, and a limited number can be accommodated in the auditorium. An induction loop is installed in the auditorium for the hard of hearing. Those wishing to make use of these facilities should book in advance.

THE PAJAMA GAME

The action is set mainly in the Sleep Tite Pajama Factory, where the new Superintendent, Sid Sorokin, is intent on keeping production at it's peak. He then encounters opposition from disgruntled employees and the Trade Union Grievance Committee, whose chief, Babe Williams, tries to enforce rules on behalf of the workers. Sid and Babe are in opposite camps but a romance is born, obvious in Sid's case but denied by Babe. Concurrently, a love story between Hines, the popular efficency expert and Hasler's secretary, Gladys, weaves its way through the story.

Back in the factory, the Union insist on a 7½ percent raise which leads to conflict between Sid and Babe. Sid, determined to clear the air, invites Gladys to a nightspot where in a heady interlude, she parts with the key to the boss's ledger. Careful examination of these closely guarded books gives Sid the ammunition he needs. Hasler is confronted, and is forced to admit that the 7½ percent raise is justified. The Union claim is granted and is followed by a rally – where everybody is satisfied.
