THE STORY OF THE OPERA

THE YEOMEN OF THE GUARD

The scene is set in Tower Green where the gallant Colonel Fairfax is to be beheaded on a charge falsely preferred against him by his cousin. Phoebe, the pretty daughter of Sergeant Meryll, falls in love with the Colonel, so that Wilfred Shadbolt, the jailor, is filled with jealousy. In order to thwart the designs of his cousin who will inherit his estate if he dies a bachelor, Colonel Fairfax is anxious to marry before he is executed. His old friend, Sir Richard Cholmondeley provides him with a bride in Elsie Maynard, a strolling player, who with her companion Jack Point arrives opportunely at the Tower. Elsie agrees to marry Fairfax, whom she has never seen, but only with the knowledge that she will be a widow within an hour. This marriage of convenience then takes place.

Matters now become complicated by the act of Sergeant Meryll who disguises Fairfax as Leonard Meryll his son, who as a reward of valour has just been promoted to the Yeomen. Fairfax is accepted without question by the Yeomen, who welcome him as a brother in arms. The solemn tolling of the bell announces the hour of execution and Tower Green rapidly fills with spectators. Great is the surprise when they learn of the escape of Fairfax; Wilfred is led away under arrest and Elsie, overcome by the knowledge that she is still a wife, collapses in the arms of a Yeoman—her own disguised husband.

The second act, still set in the same scene, opens two days later. Fairfax is still at large and Jack Point and Wilfred are both full of despair, Point having lost his bride and Wilfred a prisoner. It is arranged that Wilfred shall fire a gun and pretend that he shot Fairfax as he was swimming to safety and that the Colonel's body sank in the river. The plot is carried out, but all calculations are upset by the arrival of Leonard Meryll with a reprieve for Colonel Fairfax. Wilfred now sees how he has been hoodwinked and claims Phoebe's hand as the price of his silence. Sergeant Meryll is compelled to marry old Dame Carruthers for the same reason.

Elsie, however, is overjoyed to find that the Yeoman with whom she has fallen in love, is the husband to whom she was so strangely wed, but Jack Point's gaiety is strained to breaking point as he tries to sing and falls insensible at her feet. present
