





History and Synopsis

History

Based on the 1961 novel of the same name by Mary Hayley Bell, wife of Sir John Mills, Whistle Down the Wind became a well known British film starring the couple's daughter Hayley Mills.

The musical version of the story moved the setting from Lancashire to small town Louisiana, in the heart of the Protestant "Bible Belt". In the late 1950s, when the musical is set, the area was beset by racial tensions and the traditional society based on family, farm and church, was being eroded by industrialisation and the growth of cities. It was a time of fear and anxiety for many, while for young people, radios and televisions brought them into contact with the outside world for the first time, suggesting a life very different from the one their parents knew.


Whistle Down the Wind premiered in 1996, with music by Andrew Lloyd Webber and lyrics by Jim Steinman, known for his work with Meat Loaf and Bonnie Tyler. There have been several notable productions of Whistle Down the Wind, including the Bill Kenwright 2010 production starring Jonathan Ansell of singing group G4, as The Man.

The song "No Matter What" was released as a single by Boyzone and had unprecedented success: it went platinum, was voted the UK's Record of the Year for 1998, and hit No. I in 18 countries, becoming the most successful single ever from a Musical theatre production.

Synopsis

Set in a small God-fearing community in Louisiana in America's Deep South, this epic musical pits childhood innocence against the cynicism and fear of adults.

Just before Christmas 1959, a recently bereaved teenage girl discovers a mysterious injured man hiding in the family barn and she comes to believe he is the reincarnation of Jesus Christ. She and the town's other children vow to protect the stranger from the outside world, but in trying to help him she finds herself breaking the religious commandments she holds dear, and straying into an adult world of trials and temptations. Meanwhile, the townspeople are on the hunt for an escaped murderer...

Mark has taught at Guildford School of Acting, Mountview and Guildhall and has recently joined the Music Staff at Queenswood School, Hertfordshire. 
Frank Bundle - Stage Manager


Davinia-Rae Thompson Candy

Andrew Frost Boone






